Principal's Update, Ms. Eve:

- To help mitigate the large class sizes in the 2nd grade classrooms (32 children each), we have hired 2 substitute teachers, and are interviewing a 3rd. One is full time, the other two are part-time. Parents raised questions about how this co-teaching will work. Answer: the classroom teachers will decide how best they can utilize the extra help. These subs are former/retired teachers, one with literacy specialty. Ms. Eve suggested that parents meet directly with their child's teacher to discuss further.
- Sarah Green, School Counselor, will be holding some parent workshops this year. She has already helped some teachers incorporate the social-emotional "Ruler" program, which helps students identify and regulate their feelings, and the "Peace Path" program for conflict resolution. These complement the "Responsive Classrooms" strategy many teachers already have in place.
- We are a No Place For Hate school. The Diversity Committee is responsible for the NPFH Initiative, and sponsors a Book Club, workshops, and organizes other supporting events throughout the year.
- Climate Strike Week is next week, and PS107 has been inspired by Greta Thunberg's work on climate change. The teachers and administration are working on an event for this which will most likely take place next Friday. Tomorrow, children who will attend the Climate March in Manhattan will receive an excused absence.
- Latest on the building work: lead and asbestos abatement happened this summer; work is continuing, with an estimated completion date of July 2020.
- Curriculum night is Sep 25; principal gave an overview. A flyer and email went out with the details re: time, classrooms, and cluster teachers.
